

A Resolution Proclaiming February 4th, 2021 Transit Equity Day

WHEREAS, Transit Equity Day is a national day of action to commemorate the February 4th Birthday of Rosa Parks, an iconic figure in the movements for social justice and racial equity, who played a major role in the inception of the Civil Rights movement; and

WHEREAS, Transit Equity Day highlights Rosa Parks' 1955 pivotal work and her brave and determined advocacy for safe and reliable public transportation for all people and communities both then and today; and
